Exhibits remaining after the allotted removal time will be considered abandoned and discarded.

## Rules and Regulations PREMIUM CHECKS WILL BE VOIDED 90 DAYS AFTER THEY ARE PRINTED

No entry may be removed before 11 AM - 2 PM on Sunday, August 13. No exceptions.

1. In selecting fruit for exhibition, choose specimens that would bring the highest market price. Do not select the largest. Select medium size. In plate displays, select specimens as nearly alike as possible.
2. The following is to be used as a basis for the judging of all exhibits:

Form (natural shape of variety)
Size (medium for variety)

Color
Uniformity

## Freedom from blemish

3. Each exhibitor must designate the particular premium for which he is competing in special classes and see that the packages are properly tagged. Single specimens may not be considered or shown in variety classes.
4. Premiums will be awarded only when the exhibit complies with the standard, is meritorious, and properly named.
