WAREN COUNTY FAIR ANTIQUE TRACTOR PULLING RULES

PREMIUM CHECKS WILL BE VOIDED 90 DAYS AFTER THEY ARE PRINTED All contestants must pay regular gate admission. An entry fee of \$10.00 will be paid for each tractor per class.

#### General:

- 1. All rules are subject to interpretation and/or change by the designated Pulling/Safety Committee consisting of at least 3 designees. Participants can be disqualified for being discourteous to others.
- 2. All entrants to participate at their own risk.
- 3. Open to all 2-wheel drive, rubber tired, stock, antique tractors that are gas, diesel, or propane powered and were manufactured in 1965 or prior.
- 4. All pulls will utilize a maximum of 3.5MPH ground speed.
- 5. All tractors must not exceed factory RPMs.
- 6. All tractors to be in stock condition as they came from the factory with no pulling enhancement modifications. Alternators, electronic distributors, hitch adjusters, and straight pipes are permitted.
- 7. Tractor owner provided reference documents must be published by the same manufacturer as tractor.
- 8. No shifting of gears or power shifts during the pull.
- 9. No racing fuel, aviation fuel, or octane boosters will be permitted.
- 10. The width of the entire machine must not exceed 8'6".
- 11. The minimum age of the driver is 16 yrs. with the Pulling/Safety Committee approval.
- 12. Suspected influence of drugs or alcohol will result in immediate disqualification.
- 13. Driver to remain seated during the pull. Any loss of parts during pull will result in disqualification.
- 14. Track officials may stop a pull at any time for safety reasons including a front end height that exceeds 16".

#### **Inspection:**

- 1. All tractors will be subject to inspection by the Pulling/Safety Committee at time of weigh in and as deemed necessary at any time during the contest. All decisions are final.
- 2. Any tractors found to be unsafe or not meeting the rules, will have the opportunity for the driver to correct infraction(s).

#### Drawbar:

- 1. Tractors will pull from factory original drawbar or a drawbar that matches the factory original specifications.
- 2. Drawbar must be stationary in all directions.
- 3. For 6500lb. classes and under, the maximum drawbar height is 17" with a minimum length of 22" from the center of the axle.
- 4. For 7000lb. classes and over, the maximum drawbar height is 20" with a minimum length of 25" from the center of the axle.
- 5. A clevis, shackle, or pulling ring that utilizes 3/4" to 1-1/4" thick material while providing a 2-1/2" hole is required. All pulling rings must be secured with at least 2 bolts.
- 6. If hitch adjusters are used, the drawbar must be lowered to the height of the hook. No downward shimming will be permitted.
- 7. Tractors not having a factory stationary drawbar or having a non-adjustable stationary drawbar with a height of less than 14", will be permitted to pull from a stationary 3ph drawbar with straps or hitch adjusters.

#### Weights:

- 1. No barbell weights or weight brackets will be permitted.
- 2. Weights of the bolt on type must be securely fastened in the manufacturer's intended position for that design of weight/tractor. Suitcase weights are permitted if original equipment for the make and model of machine.
- 3. Custom weight added for what is presumed to be for the purpose of pulling enhancements will not be permitted.

#### Tires:

- 1. All tires must be within one size over or under the factory original size.
- 2. No cut tires, radial tires, or chains.

# 2023 PA Preferred® Junior Baking Contest Cookies, Brownies and Bars

The goal of the PA Preferred® Baking Contest is to encourage young people across the Commonwealth to participate in Pennsylvania's agricultural fairs by showcasing Pennsylvania grown and produced products in their contest entries.

#### **RULES:**

- Open to any individual amateur baker (ages 8 through 18 at the time of the fair's contest) who is a Pennsylvania resident. One entry per person.
- 2. Entrants may NOT have won 1st place in this PA Preferred® Junior Baking contest at any other fair in 2023.
- Entry must be six (6) individual sized portions of the baked entry item (cookies, brownies or bars).
- Entire entry must be made from scratch. No pre-packaged ingredients may be used (ex: pre-made mixes, cookie dough, pie crust, frosting, etc.). All ingredients and decorations must be edible.
- At least two (2) PA Preferred® or locally purchased ingredients must be used in the recipe. Some examples of qualifying ingredients include grains (such as oats or flour), butter, milk, eggs, fruits and/or vegetables.
- A PA Preferred® logo is <u>not</u> required because not all PA Preferred® products carry the label. The name of the ingredient and the source is sufficient (see <u>attached example</u>). Contact <u>RA-AGPAPreferred@pa.gov</u> for any assistance with qualifying ingredients.
- Entry must be submitted for judging on a food safe disposable setting. (All pans, plates and dishes are considered to be disposable and will not be returned.)
- 8. Recipe(s) must be submitted with the entry, printed on one side of 8-1/2" x 11" paper. Recipe must list all ingredients, quantities, and the preparation instructions. The name of each PA Preferred® ingredient or locally purchased ingredient must be clearly listed clearly along with the source that made/grew the product (ex: PA Preferred Milk Galliker's brand or Apples Smith Farm Orchard). Entrant's name, age, address and phone number must be printed on the back side of all the pages. (All recipes and cookies-brownies-bars will become the property of the Fair or PA Farm Show and will not be returned.)
- Refrigeration is <u>not</u> available at the fair or PA Farm Show. Entries that require refrigeration after baking must indicate
  so in the recipe. Those entries will not be sold, auctioned or otherwise distributed for consumption after judging for
  food safety reasons.

- 6. Recipe(s) listing the ingredients and the preparation instructions must be submitted with the entry (*printed on one-side of 8-1/2" x 11" size paper*). Entrant's name, address and phone number must be printed on the back of all the pages. (*All recipes and cakes will become the property of the Fair or PA Farm Show and will not be returned.*)
- 7. Refrigeration is NOT available at the Fair or PA Farm Show. Entries that require refrigeration after baking must indicate so in the recipe. Those entries will not be sold, auctioned, or otherwise distributed for consumption after judging for food safety reasons.

#### INSTRUCTIONS TO BE USED BY FAIRS AT THEIR 2023 EVENT

Each county/local fair is encouraged to conduct a 35th Annual Blue Ribbon Apple Pie Contest at their 2023 event. Listed below are the criteria which we would like each fair to use in their contest. The certified first place winner from each fair will then have the opportunity to enter an apple pie in the BLUE RIBBON APPLE PIE CONTEST at the 2024 PENNSYLVANIA FARM SHOW.

#### **RULES** for local Fair and the PA Farm Show contests are as follows:

- 1. Open to any individual amateur baker who is a Pennsylvania resident. One entry per person.
- 2. Entrants may <u>NOT</u> have won 1st place in this Blue Ribbon Apple Pie contest at any other fair in 2023.
- 3. Entire entry must be **made from scratch**. No pre-packaged ingredients may be used (ex: pre-made mixes, cookie dough, pie crust, frosting, etc.) All ingredients and decorations must be edible.
- Recipe must include at least 60% apples in the filling. It does not need to be a "traditional" two
  crusted apple pie and it can have a variety of fillings.
- 5. The entire pie must be submitted for judging in a food safe disposable pie pan. (All pans, plates and dishes are considered to be disposable and will not be returned.)
- 6. The recipe for the pie and pie crust must be submitted with the entry. It should be submitted on one side of 8 ½" by 11" paper. The recipe must list all the ingredients, quantities, and the preparation instructions. Entrant's name, address and phone number must be printed on the back side of all the pages. (All recipes and pies will become the property of the Fair or PA Farm Show and will not be returned.)
- Refrigeration is <u>not</u> available at the Fair or PA Farm Show. Entries that require refrigeration after baking must indicate so in the recipe. Those entries will not be sold, auctioned or otherwise distributed for consumption after judging for food safety reasons.
- 8. Judging will be based on the following criteria:

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Flavor	30 points
Filling: consistency, doneness, moistness & f	lavor 25 points
Crust: color, flavor, texture doneness	20 points
Overall Appearance	15 points
Creativity	10 points
TO	OTAL 100 Points

Creativity is essential to a varied competition. Do not limit your contest to a "traditional" two-crusted apple pie. We are looking for a variety of fillings in the pies; the pie must include at least 60% apples in the filling.

The recipe for the pie and pie crust will also need to be submitted when entering at the Pennsylvania Farm Show.

Each Fair must submit the Contest Summary Report verifying the winning apple pie baker. This person will then be eligible to enter the state competition at the 2024 PA Farm Show and will receive the Official Certification Form from the PA Fairs Special Baking Contest Committee.

<u>NOTE</u>: If an individual has already won 1st place at another fair in 2023 for this Blue Ribbon Apple Pie contest, that individual is now considered qualified through that Fair to compete at the 2024 PA Farm Show and is no longer eligible to enter this contest at any upcoming Fairs.
