# Rules and Regulations PREMIUM CHECKS WILL BE VOIDED 90 DAYS AFTER THEY ARE PRINTED

## There is to be no permanent eating or sleeping areas in the barns.

- 1. Warren County Fair animal health rules are to be followed in all animal departments and contests. The complete requirements are listed in the front of the Warren County Fair Premium Book.
- 2. Exhibitors will be expected to display or parade their animals as directed by the Superintendent; to accept the stall assigned without controversy; to keep their animals in an attractive appearance, and to cooperate with the department in every way that may serve to increase the educational value of the show. Stalling assignments will not be posted before Friday, August 2 No set up before Friday, August 2.
- 3. Exhibitors of livestock must inform themselves as to when their stock will be judged. Stock must be in the ring promptly on call, and a failure to comply with the order renders exhibitors liable to be ruled out of competition.
- 4. Exhibitors will be expected to keep the space they occupy in a clean and sanitary condition and remove all their equipment promptly as the Superintendent may direct.
- 5. Identification cards will be provided for each animal.
- 6. Original registration papers will be checked on all cattle by the superintendent or his committee prior to show and shall be available on show day upon request. Registered dairy cattle may be entered into one of the seven dairy breeds as recognized by the Purebred Dairy Cattle Association. All other registered dairy cattle will be entered in the "Other" breeds show. All breeds must follow their breed association's registration and show eligibility requirements. Specifically, **Jerseys**: Animals with Genetic Recovery (fully registered) certificates are

eligible. This does not include Original Animals (OA) or Provisional Registry (PR) animals. **Guernseys**: Females in Step 4 of the Genetic Recovery program are eligible. Step 4 females have a "GR" prefix in their name. No other prefixes are eligible. **Holsteins**: Any animal identified with Holstein Association, USA, Inc., that is 87% or higher Registered Holstein Ancestry (RHA) is eligible. **Red & White**: Females must carry 87% dairy bloodlines as designated by RWDCA guidelines. Dairy bloodlines include Ayrshire, Brown Swiss, Guernsey, Holstein (Black & White and Red & White), Jersey, Milking Shorthorn, Angler, Swedish Red, Aussie Red, Lineback, and Rouge Flammande.

- 7. No animal can be shown in both beef and dairy classes.
- 8. Only Female animals are to be exhibited.
- 9. The lifetime production cow class shall be 125,000 pounds for Holstein cattle and 100,000 pounds for all other breeds.
- 10. All animals while in the show ring must be identified by the exhibitor's number.
- 11. All trailers will be parked in an area so designated by the Fair Board.
- 12. The milking parlor WILL NOT be open until 5:00 pm on Monday, August 7.
- 13. Original copies of health charts must arrive on the Fairgrounds with the animals. Health charts and original registration papers must remain on the Fairgrounds until the animals leave the grounds.
- 14. All exhibitors must check in with designated personnel at the milking parlor between 7:00 PM and 9:00 PM on Monday, August 7. Bring health charts and registration papers for all entries being exhibited.

NOTE: To enter computer CLASS number, ADD the breed number to the CLASS number for the class listed below.

For example, if the breed is Holstein (250) and class is Junior Yearling Heifer (5) add 250 + 5, therefore the CLASS number would be 255.

### SECTION 2 Warren County Fair Dairy Herdsman Award

- 1. Dairy cattle exhibitors who maintain the most attractive and sanitary exhibits will be eligible for special daily premiums. Additional prizes maybe available depending on sponsorship. Through this award, exhibitors are encouraged to make their area attractive to spectators. Walkways behind and at the ends of each exhibit area should be kept clear of excess tack, manure, and debris to make their area safe and accessible. Awards are made to the person responsible for maintaining the exhibit. This person must be identified with the check in committee during Monday night check in.
- 2. All cattle exhibits will be scored on the following basis:

**Points** 

Cleanliness care of exhibit, adjacent area

20 Points

Condition, fitting, presentation of cattle in barn

20 Points

Public relations and courtesy to people

20 Points

Decoration and attractiveness of exhibit

20 Points

Cattle identification and information

20 Points
