Rules and Regulations

All contestants must pay regular gate admission.

1. All contestants must pay regular gate admission.
2. Pit gate opens at 3:30pm.
3. A tractor can enter only once in any one class. Any one driver can only enter one tractor in any one class. **Any driver can only register for 2 pulls.**
4. An entry fee of \$ 5.00 will be paid for each tractor per class.
5. All drivers in this contest under 18 years of age must have written permission from a parent or legal guardian. A waiver form must be filled out before the start of the pull.
6. Minimum age of pullers is 7 years old.
7. Drivers under the age of 18 must be able to demonstrate the ability to handle the tractor.
8. All tractors must be inspected before entering the contest. (see diagram)
9. Tractor and driver will be weighed together with helmet prior to contest and after each pull if so desired by the judges. Judges will also “tach” and inspect tractors if they desire.
10. All weights must be safely secured to the tractor. Any loss of weights will be a disqualification.
11. Helmets, long pants, and closed toe shoes are required for all pullers.
12. Only one pull allowed to each contestant unless

a tie is declared. Pull is ended when tractor engine stalls or the forward motion of tractor stops. No jerking or hole digging is allowed.

13. Driver may stop only **once** in the first 25 foot to make gear changes and will restart from the starting line.

14. Driver must stop the tractor immediately upon signal from officials.

15. If tractor or sled touches boundary line, pull will be disqualified.

16. Drivers must always remain in a seated position with at least one hand on the steering wheel.

17. First driver in each class will have the choice of taking their first pull or drop back and repull in the third entry in the class.

18. If the tractor front rises to a point that the judges feel is unsafe, the judges may stop the pull.

19. Any operator operating in an unsafe manner will be disqualified.

20. Unless directed by an official, you and your tractor will leave the track once you have pulled.

21. No dual wheels, tire chains, studded tires, ATV tires, implements or 4wd will be permitted.

22. Front weight bar measured from center of rear axle forward may not exceed 84 inches.

23. All tractors must have wheelie bars and a break away switch.

24. Only the driver and one additional pit or crew member allowed on the track.

25. DRIVERS MUST STAY WITH THE TRACTOR AT ALL TIMES ON THE TRACK.

26. Any deliberate violation of these rules will be cause to reject you and your equipment from the grounds and result in the forfeit of all prizes and trophies.

27. Decisions of judges will be FINAL in all cases.

**WARREN COUNTY FAIR ANTIQUE TRACTOR
PULLING RULES**

PREMIUM CHECKS WILL BE VOIDED 90 DAYS AFTER THEY ARE PRINTED

All contestants must pay regular gate admission.
An entry fee of \$10.00 will be paid for each tractor
per class.

General:

1. All rules are subject to interpretation and/or change by the designated Pulling/Safety Committee consisting of at least 3 designees. Participants can be disqualified for being discourteous to others.
2. All entrants to participate at their own risk.

3. Open to all 2-wheel drive, rubber tired, stock, antique tractors that are gas, diesel, or propane powered and were manufactured in 1965 or prior.
4. All pulls will utilize a maximum of 3.5MPH ground speed.
5. All tractors must not exceed factory RPMs.
6. All tractors to be in stock condition as they came from the factory with no pulling enhancement modifications. Alternators, electronic distributors, hitch adjusters, and straight pipes are permitted.
7. Tractor owner provided reference documents must be published by the same manufacturer as tractor.
8. No shifting of gears or power shifts during the pull.
9. No racing fuel, aviation fuel, or octane boosters will be permitted.
10. The width of the entire machine must not exceed 8'6".
11. The minimum age of the driver is 16 yrs. with the Pulling/Safety Committee approval.
12. Suspected influence of drugs or alcohol will result in immediate disqualification.
13. Driver to remain seated during the pull. Any loss of parts during pull will result in disqualification.
14. Track officials may stop a pull at any time for safety reasons including a front end height that exceeds 16".

Inspection:

1. All tractors will be subject to inspection by the Pulling/Safety Committee at time of weigh in and as deemed necessary at any time during the contest. All decisions are final.
2. Any tractors found to be unsafe or not meeting the rules, will have the opportunity for the driver to correct infraction(s).

Drawbar:

1. Tractors will pull from factory original drawbar or a drawbar that matches the factory original specifications.
2. Drawbar must be stationary in all directions.
3. For 6500lb. classes and under, the maximum drawbar height is 17" with a minimum length of 22" from the center of the axle.
4. For 7000lb. classes and over, the maximum drawbar height is 20" with a minimum length of 25" from the center of the axle.

5. A clevis, shackle, or pulling ring that utilizes 3/4" to 1-1/4" thick material while providing a 2-1/2" hole is required. All pulling rings must be secured with at least 2 bolts.

6. If hitch adjusters are used, the drawbar must be lowered to the height of the hook. No downward shimming will be permitted.

7. Tractors not having a factory stationary drawbar or having a non-adjustable stationary drawbar with a height of less than 14", will be permitted to pull from a stationary 3ph drawbar with straps or hitch adjusters.

Weights:

1. No barbell weights or weight brackets will be permitted.
2. Weights of the bolt on type must be securely fastened in the manufacturer's intended position for that design of weight/tractor. Suitcase weights are permitted if original equipment for the make and model of machine.
3. Custom weight added for what is presumed to be for the purpose of pulling enhancements will not be permitted.

Tires:

1. All tires must be within one size over or under the factory original size.
2. No cut tires, radial tires, or chains.

3. Contestants must register to compete.
4. Competition to start at 6 PM.
5. Registration will be from 5- 6 PM.
6. An entry fee of \$5.00 PLUS a fee of \$1.00 per class.
7. Contestants will strive to project a professional atmosphere at all times.
8. Decisions of the Head judge are FINAL.
9. Any contestant who does not conduct himself in a sportsmanlike manner, will be disqualified by the Head judge.
10. The Head judge will have the right to stop any contestant operating in an unsafe manner.
11. Chaps, ear, and eye protection **MUST** be worn during all chain saw events.
12. Contestants can enter more than once in a sawing class; however the saw may only be entered once per class.
13. Chain saws must be stock appearing and covers must be in place.
14. Shin guards will be required for the chopping events.
15. Only those competing will be allowed in the arena.
16. The specific rules of each event will be explained at the competitors meeting to be held at 5:45 PM. **ANY QUESTIONS WILL BE ANSWERED AT THIS TIME.**

Application deadlines are at the beginning of May of the year of the contest. Be sure to “like” the “Warren County PA Fair Queen Pageant” on Facebook or check the Warren County Fair website at www.warrencountyfair.net for information and applications or contact a Fair Queen committee member in the winter of the year leading up to the Fair Queen Contest.

Qualifications:

1. Must be a US citizen, and a resident of Warren County and have participated in or attended the Warren County Fair.
2. Must be at least age 16 but no older than 20 years of age by June 1st of present year.
3. Must be single, never married, have no children and must not marry nor get pregnant during her reign.
4. Must have never committed or have been arrested or convicted of a crime.
5. Have parent or guardian’s consent.
6. Must complete an application and participate in orientation and judging activities.
7. Prepare a 2-minute persuasive speech, “Why you should come to my Fair.”
8. Judges will interview each contestant.
9. Poise and appearance will be considered.
10. Each contestant will be asked an impromptu question on stage.
11. Must have and demonstrate a personal knowledge of the Warren County Fair and agriculture.
12. Must follow all rules as set forth by the PA State Fair Queen program, including dress code.

Qualifications for PA State Fair Queen Contest:

1. Be female who is a US citizen and a resident of Pennsylvania.
2. Be at least age 16, but no older than 20 years of age as of June 1 of the year entering the local contest.
3. Be certified as the winner by the local fair where she was crowned.
4. Have not been a former local Fair Queen winner, nor a former State Fair Queen Contestant.
5. Not hold any other state title for any other

commodity group or pageant during her reign.

6. Have her parent(s)’ or guardian(s)’ consent to enter the competition.
7. Be single, have never been married, have not been pregnant nor given birth to a child.
8. Act in accordance with the PA Fair Queen “Behavior Policy.”
9. Meet all time commitments, Queen Obligations and Dress Codes as set forth by the PA Fair Queen Program.

WARREN COUNTY FAIR JR. MISS

1. Must be a US citizen, **and** a resident of Warren County **and** have participated in or attended the Warren County Fair
2. Must be at least age 12 but no older than 15 years of age by June 1st of present year.
3. Must be single, never married, have no children, and must not marry, nor get pregnant during her reign.
4. Must have never committed or have been arrested or convicted of a crime.
5. Have parent or guardian’s consent.
6. Must complete an application and participate in orientation and judging activities.
7. **Prepare a 2 minute speech on “Why you should come to the Warren County Fair”**
8. Judges will interview each contestant.
9. Poise and appearance will be considered.
10. Each contestant will be asked an impromptu question.
11. ***Must have and demonstrate a personal knowledge of the Warren County Fair and agriculture.***
12. Must follow all rules as set forth by the PA State Fair Queen program, including dress code.

LITTLE PRINCESS PROGRAM (AGES 6 – 8)

The Warren County Fair Little Princess Program is a non-competitive program designed to get young girls introduced and interested in the Warren County Fair and Fair Queen contest.

Girls who live in Warren County, ages 6 – 8 (Age as of August 1 of present year) are invited to sign up for the Little Princess Program. All little princesses will be introduced by the emcee and

given a tiara on stage by a member of the current Fair Queen Court. There will also be one day where the little princess participants will get to interact with the queen contestants and rehearse where they will stand on stage.

There is a cost of \$20 per participant and includes a rhinestone tiara, T-shirt, and participation in the program.

Little princesses will perform a short dance routine and be asked an on-stage question.

All little princess participants will be required to attend two rehearsals, one the week prior to the fair and the second the day before the contest in the KeyBank Pavilion (Princess must attend to participate). Rehearsals will be for participants only. Parents can pick their princess up at the end of practice.

Little princesses will be required to wear one *age-appropriate* party dress for the entire event (dance, introduction, and question). Shoes can be by preference (sandals, dress shoes, cowboy boots, etc.). Only princess participants will be allowed backstage. Please, no makeup!

The Warren County Fair Princess Program is a program designed to get young girls introduced and interested in the Warren County Fair and Fair Queen contest. The 9-11 age group will compete

and one will be crowned as the Warren County Fair Princess!

Girls who live in Warren County, ages 9 – 11 (Age as of August 1 of present year) are invited to sign up for the Princess Program.

Entrant's name, address and phone number must be printed on the **back** side of all the pages. (All recipes and cakes will become the property of the Fair or PA Farm Show and will not be returned.)
9. Refrigeration is not available at the fair or PA Farm Show. Entries that require refrigeration after baking must indicate so in the recipe. Those entries will not be sold, auctioned or otherwise distributed for consumption after judging for food safety reasons.

2024 PA Preferred® Junior Baking Contest Cookies, Brownies and Bars

The goal of the PA Preferred® Baking Contest is to encourage young people across the Commonwealth to participate in Pennsylvania's agricultural fairs by showcasing Pennsylvania grown and produced products in their contest entries.

RULES:

1. Open to any individual **amateur** baker (ages 8 through 18 at the time of the fair's contest) who is a Pennsylvania resident. One entry per person.
2. **Entrants may NOT have won 1st place in this PA Preferred® Junior Baking contest at any other fair in 2024.**
3. Entry must be **six (6) individual sized portions** of the baked entry item (cookies, brownies or bars).
4. The Cookies, Brownies or Bars, and any fillings and frostings, must be **made from scratch with edible ingredients**. **No** pre-packaged ingredients may be used (ex: *no pre-made mixes, cookie dough, pie crust, frosting, etc.*). Any decorations must just be edible.
5. At least two (2) PA Preferred® or locally produced ingredients must be used in the recipe. Some examples of qualifying ingredients include grains (*such as oats or flour*), butter, milk, eggs, fruits and/or vegetables.
6. **A PA Preferred® logo is not required** because not all PA Preferred® products carry the label. The name of the ingredient and the source is sufficient (*see attached example*). Contact RA-AGPAPreferred@pa.gov for any assistance with qualifying ingredients.
7. Entry must be submitted for judging **on a food safe disposable setting**. (*All pans, plates and dishes are considered to be disposable and will not be returned.*)
8. Recipe(s) must be submitted with the entry, printed on one side of 8-1/2" x 11" sheets of paper. Recipe must list all ingredients, quantities, and the preparation instructions. **The name of each PA Preferred® ingredient or locally produced ingredient must be clearly listed along with the name of the source that made/grew the product** (ex: *PA Preferred Milk – Galliker's brand or Apples - Smith Farm Orchard*). Entrant's name, age, address and phone number must be printed on the back side of all the pages. (*All recipes and cookies-brownies-bars will become the property of the Fair or PA Farm Show and will not be returned.*)
9. Refrigeration is **not** available at the fair or PA Farm Show. Entries that require refrigeration after baking must indicate so in the recipe. Those entries will not be sold, auctioned or otherwise distributed for consumption after judging for food safety reasons.

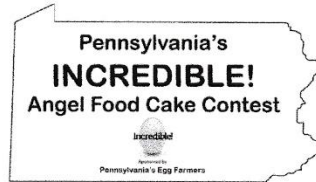

4. The recipe shall include eggs that were produced in Pennsylvania, if possible.
5. The entire cake entry must be submitted for judging **on cardboard or other food safe disposable setting**. (*All pans, plates and dishes are considered to be disposable and will not be returned.*)
6. Recipe(s) listing the ingredients and the preparation instructions must be submitted with the entry (*printed on one-side of 8-1/2" x 11" size sheets of paper*). Entrant's name, address and phone number must be printed on the back of all the pages. (*All recipes and cakes will become the property of the Fair or PA Farm Show and will not be returned.*)
7. Refrigeration is NOT available at the Fair or PA Farm Show. Entries that require refrigeration after baking must indicate so in the recipe. Those entries will not be sold, auctioned, or otherwise distributed for consumption after judging for food safety reasons.

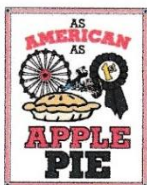

INSTRUCTIONS TO BE USED BY FAIRS AT THEIR 2024 EVENT

Each county/local fair is encouraged to conduct a 36th Annual Blue Ribbon Apple Pie Contest at their 2024 event. Listed below are the criteria which we would like each fair to use in their contest. The certified first place winner from each fair will then have the opportunity to enter an apple pie in the BLUE RIBBON APPLE PIE CONTEST at the 2025 PENNSYLVANIA FARM SHOW.

RULES for local Fair and the PA Farm Show contests are as follows:

1. Open to any individual **amateur** baker who is a Pennsylvania resident. One entry per person.
2. **Entrants may NOT have won 1st place in this Blue Ribbon Apple Pie contest at any other fair in 2024.**
3. The Apple Pie, including fillings and crust, must be **made from scratch with edible ingredients**. No pre-packaged ingredients may be used (ex: no pre-made mixes, cookie dough, pie crust, frosting, etc.) Any decorations must just be edible.
4. **Recipe must include at least 60% apples in the filling.** It does not need to be a "traditional" two crusted apple pie and it can have a variety of fillings.
5. The entire pie must be submitted for judging in a food safe disposable pie pan. *(All pans, plates and dishes are considered to be disposable and will not be returned.)*
6. The recipe for the pie and pie crust must be submitted with the entry. It should be submitted on one side of 8 1/2" by 11" sheets of paper. The recipe must list all the ingredients, quantities, and the preparation instructions. Entrant's name, address and phone number must be printed on the back side of all the pages. *(All recipes and pies will become the property of the Fair or PA Farm Show and will not be returned.)*
7. Refrigeration is not available at the Fair or PA Farm Show. Entries that require refrigeration after baking must indicate so in the recipe. Those entries will not be sold, auctioned or otherwise distributed for consumption after judging for food safety reasons.
8. Judging will be based on the following criteria:

Flavor	30 points
Filling: consistency, doneness, moistness & flavor	25 points
Crust: color, flavor, texture doneness	20 points
Overall Appearance	15 points
Creativity	10 points
TOTAL	100 Points

Creativity is essential to a varied competition. Do not limit your contest to a "traditional" two-crust apple pie. We are looking for a variety of fillings in the pies; the pie must include at least 60% apples in the filling.

Each Fair must submit the Contest Summary Report verifying the winning apple pie baker. This person will then be eligible to enter the state competition at the 2025 PA Farm Show and will receive the Official PA Farm Show Certification Entry Form directly from the PA Fairs Special Baking Contest Committee by December 2.

NOTE: *If an individual has already won 1st place at another fair in 2024 for this Blue Ribbon Apple Pie contest, that individual is now considered qualified through that Fair to compete at the 2025 PA Farm Show and is no longer eligible to enter this contest at any upcoming Fairs.*
