Entry Fee \$2.00 per animal must accompany entry form.

**NO LATE ENTRIES WILL BE ACCEPTED.**

ALL ENTRIES MUST BE PRE-ENTERED. If there is a question that a certain item will be ready or not at fair time, pre-enter anyway.

PRE-ENTER BY PROPER CLASS AND DESCRIPTION

NOTE: To enter computer CLASS number ADD the breed number to the CLASS number for classes listed below. For example, if the breed is Charolais (130) and the class is Junior Yearling Heifer (15), add 130 + 15, therefore the CLASS number would be 145. If no breed is listed use the CLASS number only.

### Rules and Regulations

**PREMIUM CHECKS WILL BE VOIDED 90 DAYS AFTER THEY ARE PRINTED**

**There is to be no permanent eating or sleeping areas in the barns.**

1. Warren County Fair animal health rules are to be followed in all animal departments and contests. The complete requirements are listed in the front of the Warren County Fair Premium Book.
2. When on exhibition in the ring, each animal must be under halter, and in charge of owner's

representative. Any animal that is unruly, not under the control of exhibitor or poses a threat to the safety of others will be dismissed from the show ring and will not be eligible for judging.

3. All animals must be registered with their respective breed association **and must show registration papers.**

4. Animals that aren't registered may show as commercial, but both parents must be beef animals. Only animals registered and showing papers are eligible for Classes 10, 21 – 24.

5. All bulls over one year must be shown with a nose ring or show style nose lead.

6. **ALL ANIMALS WHILE IN THE SHOW RING MUST BE IDENTIFIED BY THE EXHIBITOR'S NUMBER.**

7. All trailers will be parked in an area so designated by the Fair Board.

8. No ribbons, trophies, awards, equipment or exhibits may be removed at any time before the close of the Fair or Department.

23. Produce of Dam - 2 animals any age either sex, the produce of one cow, need not be owned by one exhibitor.
24. Dam and Offspring - Offspring may not be older than 2 years. Need not be owned by exhibitor.
25. Prospect Steer – Castrated calves born 1/1/24 – 3/30/24

## SECTION 2 MARKET STEERS

### Rules and Regulations

1. Steers will not be judged separately by breeds. They will be divided as evenly as possible into three weight classes.
2. Steers will be weighed at the fair at a time designated by the committee.
3. Minimum weight for any steer will be 900 pounds.
4. State health rules and regulations will be followed.

## SECTION 4 GOOD HOUSEKEEPING AWARD

### Rules and Regulations

1. Cattle exhibitors who maintain the most attractive and sanitary exhibits will be eligible for special daily premiums.
2. All cattle exhibits will be scored on the following basis:

#### Points

Cleanliness of animals	20
Cleanliness of bedding	20
Entry card and ribbons won, properly displayed	10
Keeping grain, hay and feed presentable	15
Keeping all equipment sanitary and neat	10
Keeping aisles clean and clear	15
Courtesy to people	10
<b>Total</b>	<b>100</b>

3. Inspections to be made unannounced. Prizes will be awarded daily Tuesday thru Saturday. No award on the first day of fair.

4. To be eligible for award, exhibitor must have at least three head of cattle.

5. 4-H exhibitors are not eligible for good housekeeping premiums in department 3.
