premium unless serviceably sound.

4. Horses entered as matched pairs must have one
exhibitor.

5. Animals or combination of animals owned by
one exhibitor may be entered in the classes below.

6. No grade stallions shall be accepted for entry.

7. Farm horses should not have scotch plates or
scotch housing.

8. All animals entered **must** compete and be shown
in halter class and hitch class if broken.

9. In no case is it permissible to show mixed breeds

each other for premiums.
