MUST BE MADE ON OR BEFORE JULY 30
TO WARREN COUNTY FAIR, BOX 230,
PITTSFIELD, PA 16340.

ALL STILL ENTRIES MUST BE IN PLACE
BY 7 PM. SUNDAY. STILL EXHIBITS
CANNOT BE REMOVED UNTIL BETWEEN
11 AM AND 2 PM SUNDAY. DAIRY
ANIMALS MUST BE IN PLACE BY 8PM ON
MONDAY. YOUTH LIVESTOCK AUCTION
ANIMALS MUST BE IN PLACE BY 5PM ON
MONDAY. HORSES AND REMAINING
LIVESTOCK MUST BE IN PLACE BY 7AM
TUESDAY. LIVESTOCK, DAIRY, AND
HORSES CANNOT BE REMOVED BEFORE
11PM SATURDAY. NO LATE ENTRIES
WILL BE ACCEPTED ALL ENTRIES MUST
BE PRE-ENTERED. IF THERE IS A
QUESTION THAT A CERTAIN ITEM WILL
BE READY OR NOT AT FAIR TIME, PRE-
ENTER ANYWAY. PRE-ENTER BY
PROPER CLASS AND DESCRIPTION AS
LISTED IN BOOK. AN ENTRY FEE MUST
ACCOMPANY THE ENTRY BLANK IF
APPLICABLE.

ALL TRAILERS WILL BE PARKED IN AN
AREA SO DESIGNATED BY THE FAIR
BOARD. NO RIBBONS, TROPHIES,
AWARDS, EQUIPMENT OR EXHIBIT MAY
BE REMOVED AT ANY TIME BEFORE THE
CLOSE OF THE FAIR OR DEPARTMENT.

NOTE: To enter CLASS number follow the rules
for open class events pertaining to animals. All
other entries use the SECTION AND CLASS
number listed for the class.

NOTE: Champion ribbons will be awarded only
when 3 or more animals are in the class.

ELIGIBILITY: Exhibitors must be members of a
regularly organized Warren County 4-H Club or
special interest group carrying a project in the
field they wish to make entry and be under the
supervision of the Pennsylvania State University
Extension 4-H by June 1, preceding the Fair.

Students enrolled in an accepted Warren County
Vocational School curriculum must be
conducting a project in the class in which they
wish to make an entry. Students enrolled in
general home economics in a comprehensive
high school are considered as qualifying. All
entries shall be approved prior to the Fair by a
member of the Pennsylvania Department of
Education, Agriculture and Home Economics
staff or their designated representative.

Rules and Regulations

**There is to be no permanent
eating or sleeping areas in
the barns.**

1. Warren County Fair animal health rules are to
be followed in all animal departments and
contests. The complete requirements are listed
in the front of the Warren County Fair Premium
Book.
2. All animals must meet the required health

rules of the fair and general rules.

3. Member must be present and in charge of their animals at the time of the judging.

4. A member may exhibit one animal per class.

5. Upon arrival at the fair, the member will be responsible for the handling, care, fitting and showing of their animal. **No adult is permitted to prepare the animal for fitting or showing in Department 10. Premiums may be forfeited.**

6. All 4-H animal science youth are required to participate in training regarding "Quality Animal Management" annually. All youth are required to complete a survey regarding these practices.

7. Only one entry per exhibitor per breed in classes 601-604.

8. No entry fee for classes 601-604 but each animal must have been entered in its individual class.

9. Limit of 2 entries per class 1, 2 & 5-8.

10. Market goats cannot be shown in breeding classes and vice versa.

11. All goats being shown in the market section must be wethers or does. **NO BUCKS TO BE SHOWN IN MARKET OR PACK CLASSES.**

12. Market goats are eligible for the livestock sale.

13. Only 1 entry per exhibitor in the market goat section and all market goats are shown together regardless of breed broken out by weight.

Weight classes will be determined at time of weigh in and divided as evenly as possible.

14. Cloverbud 4-H members will be permitted to participate in the Cloverbud showmanship class. The Cloverbud members do not need to own the animal they are showing. No placings or premiums will be given for the class. Cloverbud 4-H members must register through zSuites by June 1 to be eligible to participate.

Classifications and premiums listed are to apply to each of the following breeds.

NOTE: For Breeding Project classes 1-10. To enter CLASS number, ADD the breed number to the CLASS number for the classes listed below. For example, if the breed is Alpine (100) and the class is Buck (1), add 100 plus 1 to get a CLASS number of 101. If no breed is listed, use the CLASS number only.

601. Dam and Daughter – all breeds

602. Get of Sire – All breeds; 3 goats with same sire. Sire need not be present.

603. Goat Herd Group – all breeds; 4 breeding animals owned by exhibitor.

604. Best Doe Bred by Exhibitor-all breeds Ribbon

Showmanship and Fitting

Members may show their project animal in the contest.

Senior ages 15-18 as of Jan. 1

Intermediate ages 12-14 as of Jan. 1

Junior ages 8-11 as of Jan. 1

Cloverbud (ages 5-7 as of Jan 1) *must be registered by June 1 through zSuites by June 1 to be eligible to participate.

- 802. Showmanship, Intermediate
- 803. Showmanship, Junior
- 804. Showmanship Cloverbud Ribbon

- 805. Fitting Senior
- 806. Fitting Intermediate

809. Costume Class Ribbon
May be divided into groups, as deemed necessary by goat chairs. Member may select one animal for class entry. Judging will be based on creativity of animal costume and exhibitor costume.

PACK GOATS

Pack Goat Class will be after the costume class.
Class

- 810. Novice – no experience (0-3 months)
- 811. Beginner – goat some, child none or goat none & child some (3 months – 1 year)
- 812. Intermediate – goat & child have 1-2 years
- 813. Experienced – goat & child have 2 plus years
- 814. String Pack – more than one goat
- 815. Adult (18 and over) Exhibition only.

GOOD HOUSEKEEPING AWARDS

Rules and Regulations

1. Open to animal 4-H Clubs with three or more animals of the same species exhibited. Clubs must be displayed as a single club unit to be judged.
- 2 Each 4-H club is only eligible to be judged one time for Good Housekeeping regardless of how many species of animals they represent.
3. Classes to be decided at the discretion of the Warren County Fair.
4. Clubs maintaining the most attractive and sanitary exhibits will be eligible for special daily premiums and a plaque to be rotated daily to the club exhibits selected by the judge as the best for the day.

5. Inspections will be made unannounced. Prizes will be awarded daily. NO AWARDS on the first day of the Fair.

6. All exhibits will be scored on the following basis:

Cleanliness of animals	20
Cleanliness of bedding	20
Entry card and Ribbons won, properly and attractively displayed	10
Feed (hay and grain) presentable	15
All equipment sanitary and neat	10
Aisles clean and orderly	15
Courtesy to people	10
Total	100
