## YOUTH LIVESTOCK

(Youth under 20 years of age as of Jan 1 of current year)

**There is to be no permanent eating or sleeping areas in the barns.**

If entered in Department 10 4-H, you are not qualified to show in Department 11 Youth. Junior Division - See Dept. 11,

Applications for all other entries must be made on or before July 1 to Warren County Fair, P.O. Box 230, Pittsfield, PA 16340.

All still entries must be in place by 7 PM Sunday. Still exhibits cannot be removed until between 11 PM – 2 PM Sunday. Dairy animals must be in place by 8 PM on Monday. **Youth market class animals must be in place by 5 PM on Monday for weight class determination** remaining livestock must be in place by 7 PM Tuesday. Livestock, dairy, and horses cannot be removed before 11 PM Saturday. No late entries will be accepted all entries must be pre-entered if there is a question that a certain item will be ready or not at fair time, pre-enter anyway. Pre-enter by proper class and description as listed in book. An entry fee must accompany the entry blank if applicable. All trailers will be parked in an area so designated by the fair board. No ribbons, trophies, awards, equipment or exhibit may be removed at any time before the close of the fair or department.

An animal can only be shown in any particular class one time by one exhibitor.

Note: to enter class number, follow the rules for open class events pertaining to animals. All other entries use the section and class number listed for the class.

Note: champion ribbons will be awarded only when 3 or more animals are in the class.

All exhibitors must check in with designated personnel at the milking parlor between 8 PM -10 PM on Monday of fair week. Bring health charts and registration papers for all entries being exhibited.

1. Warren County Fair animal health rules are to be followed in all animal departments and contests. The complete requirements are listed in the front of the Warren County Fair Premium Book.

2. Refer to General Rules and to Rules and Regulations in Department 2.

3. Youth must be present and have charge of their animals at the time of judging.

**4. OWNERSHIP**

A. Animals bred and owned by the exhibitor must be registered in the exhibitor's name June 1.

B. Animals not bred by the exhibitor must be transferred into exhibitor's name on or before June 1. Date of transfer shown on the registration certificate will be considered as date of ownership in all classes.

C. Leased animals are eligible to be shown if a management plan is carried out.

D. Grade animals are permitted to be shown in the Warren County Dairy Show only.

E. Animals intending to be shown at regional and state Junior Dairy Shows must follow the same breed registration requirements as the PA Junior Dairy Show.

6. No animal over one year of age should have

horns.

7. Health papers issued by the Pennsylvania Bureau of Animal Industry are required for all animals and will be checked by the show personnel during check in on Monday. A copy of the health paperwork must stay at the fairgrounds.

8. Any substitution of an animal or changes in showmanship and fitting participation must receive prior approval from the Dairy Show Committee. Substitutions made for the Tuesday fitting competition will not be placed. The substituted showmanship animal must receive approval from the Dairy Show Committee and cannot be used by another 4-H member for showmanship. Exemptions from participating during the normally scheduled fitting or showmanship competition must be cleared with the show committee and will only be granted in cases of scheduling conflict with other fair events and/or emergency.

9. ENTRY FEE OF \$2.00 PER AMINAL MUST ACCOMPANY THE ENTRY BLANK

Dairy exhibitors are required to complete all entry data requested online. For grade animals, place “N/A” in the registration number data cell.

10. No ribbons, trophies, awards, equipment, or exhibit may be removed at any time before the close of the Fair or Department.

11. Only Female animals can be exhibited.

12. Yearlings in milk will show as Jr. Two year old

## Showmanship and Fitting

1. In the fitting competition, exhibitors will clip, brush, and groom their animal. All exhibitors MUST participate or make appropriate arrangements with the Dairy Show Committee to complete the year. Seniors will be scored on clipping animal's entire body; Intermediates will be scored on the clipping the entire rear of the animal. Juniors will be scored on clipping tail and tail head. **ONLY THE ANIMAL'S HEAD MAY BE CLIPPED BEFORE THE COMPETITION.** The animal being used for the Fitting Competition must have adequate hair growth for the contest.

2. Clothes and person should be neat and clean. A white shirt and black or white pants or skirt (no denim) should be worn. The entry number will be considered part of the uniform and must be displayed appropriately while in the show ring. Harnesses may be worn as long as the

number is visible. Shoes must be closed toed with boots being the preferred style worn in the ring. Uniforms bearing farm names or advertising will not be acceptable.

3. Exhibitors are responsible for getting their animals to the show ring when the class is shown. Judging will be continuous. No lunch breaks. Classes in each division will be shown in the same order as listed. The judges' decisions will be final.

4. Fitting and showmanship classes may divide large age groups into subgroups 1 and 2 to alleviate overcrowding and provide safety for members and animals.

Deadline to sign up for the cheese auction is Monday night by the end of check-in.

Eligible participants must be a minimum of 8 years - 21 years maximum age as of January 1st of the current year.

Only ONE cow per entry.

Participants MUST have a milking cow entered AND exhibited in the open dairy show at the Warren County Fair to participate.

The minimum pounds of cheese to be included in the basket is 51bs.

Additional items can be added to the cheese basket at the participants discretion. NO ALCOHOL.

Each participant will receive 4 day passes to the fair to share with potential buyers.

Cheese baskets will be sold auction style.

Cow and basket will be presented by the participant during the auction.

Individual pictures will be taken at the end of each sale. Only to include: Participant, Helper, Buyer and Dairy Princess.

Thank you's MUST be filled out and returned before you leave the Dairy Barns in order to receive your check.

Example: put your cow away, write your thank you, turn it in and you're free to go!

A 5% commission fee from each sale will be collected by the Dairy Committee in order to support future cheese auctions.

Dress for Success: Nice blue jeans – no holes, rips or tears.

Boys – Button down t-shirt, long sleeve button down or polo.

Girls – Button down, Polo or nice blouse. NO V cuts.

Shoes- shall be Show appropriate

### **There is to be no permanent eating or sleeping areas in the barns.**

1. Warren County Fair animal health rules are to be followed in all animal departments and contests. The complete requirements are listed in the front of the Warren County Fair Premium Book.
2. When exhibition in the ring, each animal must be under halter and in charge of owner or owner's representative. Any animal that is unruly, not under the control of exhibitor or poses a threat to the safety of others will be dismissed from the show ring and will not be eligible for judging.
3. An entry fee of \$2.00 per animal must accompany the entry blank.
4. All animals must be registered with their respective breed association.
5. Registration papers must be available for inspection.
6. Animals that are not registered may show as

commercial, but both parents must be beef animals. Only animals registered and showing papers are eligible for classes except 9 and 10.

7. Upon arrival at the fair, the member will be responsible for handling, care, fitting and showing of their animal. **No adult is permitted to prepare animal for fitting or showing in Department 11. Premiums may be forfeited.**

8. Only animals registered and showing papers are eligible for classes 9 and 10.

NOTE: To enter CLASS number, ADD the breed number to the CLASS number for the classes listed below. For example, if the breed is Angus (100) and the class is Summer Yearling Heifer (4), add 100 plus 4 to get the CLASS number of 104. If no breed is listed, use the CLASS number only.

## Market Beef

### Rules and Regulations

1. Animals shown in breeding classes cannot be shown in market classes or vice versa.
2. Animal must be declared as "Small Breed" on paperwork at initial weigh-in. Height regulations, maximum hip height of 47". The measurement will be taken at fair weigh-in, a standardized measurement system (set up the same, measured by same person). Animal must weigh MINIMUM 500lbs, and MAXIMUM 1000lbs, at fair weigh in. **If animal does not meet weight requirements, it will not be allowed to show.** If the animal meets the minimum weight of 900 the animal would have the option to show as a lightweight market steer instead of a small breed animal.
3. The market beef will be divided as equally as possible into 3 weight classes. All market beef will be weighed at the fair. The number of classes may fluctuate and will be established at the discretion of the section chair. Market Classes may be split at the discretion of the chair if class size exceeds 7 entries.
4. Weigh in to be done beginning at 5:30 PM on Monday of the fair.

#### Fitting Competition Details:

Members must enter an animal ready to be fit. All animals need bathed and clipped prior to entering the ring. Absolutely no fitting may be completed prior to the Fitting Competition. Members will be divided into three categories: senior (ages 15-18), intermediate (ages 12-14), and junior (ages 8-11). Seniors will have 35 minutes to fit from the front shoulders of the animal and back including the tail. Intermediates will have 25 minutes to fit the back hips, legs, and tail. Juniors will have 15 minutes to fit the tail head and the tail. Items excluded from being used during the Fitting Competition include cattle chutes, any blow dryers larger than handheld, and products prohibited for use on animals. **Parents will not be permitted in the ring during the contest.**

8. Drenching, force or bottle feeding of any sheep or lamb, or use of icing and/or any temperature altering products, including but not limited to wet towels, will result in disqualification of the

exhibitor from show/sale and exhibit will be removed from the fair. Additionally any animal found with towels draped on it show day, or entering the show ring wet will be presumed in violation of this rule and disqualified.

Please reference Department 4 Sheep rules for other applicable rules.

4. A member may exhibit one animal per market class.

5. Upon arrival at the fair, the member will be responsible for the handling, care, fitting and showing of their animal. **No adult is permitted to prepare the animal for fitting or showing in Department 11. Premiums may be forfeited.**

6. Only one entry per exhibitor per breed in classes 601-604.

7. No entry fee for classes 601-604 but each animal must have been entered in its individual class.

8. Limit of 2 entries class 1, 2 & 5-8.

9. Market goats cannot be shown in breeding classes and vice versa.

10. All goats being shown in the market section and pack class must be wethered or does. **NO BUCKS TO BE SHOWN IN THE MARKET PROGRAM OR PACK CLASS.**

11. Market goats are not eligible for the livestock auction.

12. Only 1 entry per exhibitor in the market goat section and all market goats are shown together regardless of breed broken out by weight.

Weight classes will be determined at time of weigh in and divided as evenly as possible.

13. Goats must be older than 6 months of age to participate in Pack Class obstacle course.

14. Any goat participating in the Pack Goat class must have a properly fitted pack saddle or day pack.

15. North American Pack Goat Association rules and guidelines will be used as a resource to support pack class.

**Rules and Regulations**

1. Warren County Fair animal health rules are to be followed in all animal departments and

contests. The complete requirements are listed in the front of the Warren County Fair Premium Book. Working cattle may not be entered as open dairy cattle or 4-H dairy cattle.

2. The fair reserves the right of refuse any or all entries.

3. Animals may be either sex.
4. All bulls over 6 months old must be castrated.
5. All animals must be trained to the yoke and cart or sled.
6. All cattle must be shown without use of rings, lines, rope or halter.
7. Yokes may be separated and only one shown as single in same age class as yoke.
8. Yokes may be made up of any 2 youth trained cattle. Each animal can show in only one yoke.
9. All yokes will be shown in class of oldest animal.
10. Animals must be born prior to 6/1 of the current year.
11. Upon arrival at the fair, the youth will be responsible for the handling, care, fitting and showing of their animal. No adult is permitted to prepare the animal for fitting or showing in Department 11. Premiums may be forfeited.
12. All trailers will be parked in an area so designated by the Fair Board.
13. No ribbons, trophies, awards, equipment, or exhibit may be removed at any time before the close of the Fair or Department.
14. Eligibility ages for all members:
  - 100 Senior ages 15-18 as of Jan. 1
  - 110 Intermediate ages 12-14 as of Jan. 1
  - 120 Junior ages 8-11 as of Jan. 1

1. All cattle are required to weigh in earlier in the week at a time TBD.
2. The loaded weight percentage of the cattle and the time limit is to be determined by the superintendent.
3. All cattle and teamsters have to be ready at the announced time of the event.
4. Light use of the goad or whip will be permitted. The teamster will be afforded one warning by the superintendent. Continued abuse will be grounds for disqualification.
5. Teamsters may have one helper to hook the chain onto the drag. The helper may follow behind the drag. The helper is not allowed to have a goad or whip. The helper must remain quiet during the pull.

6. Cattle must remain hooked to the drag at all times. If unhooked intentionally, then the pull will be pinned at the spot and ruled a completed pull.
7. If the load is pulled out of bounds it will be pinned at the last spot it was in bounds. That pin will serve as the measured distance until such time that the load is pulled back in bounds.
8. Time will start when drag is moved.
9. When measuring, it must be in a straight line to the nearest point on the drag. The front of the drag must touch the line before making a turn. The drag should be turned more than ½ ways or the back of the drag must be over the line to get a full-line measure.
10. If a breakdown occurs, the teamster may take the distance they have pulled thus far, or they may go the end of the line and have a second try.
11. Any animal that the superintendent feels is too thin or seems dehydrated will be disqualified. Animals with open sores or if they are lame will also be disqualified.
12. The superintendent may order a load pinned and ruled a complete pull if an unsafe situation is encountered.
13. There will be no lines, ropes or halters allowed on the cattle during the pull. Animals must be under control at all times.
14. Running with a team will not be permitted.
15. Cattle should be clean and presentable.
16. Anyone who does not abide by these rules will be disqualified.
